

# THE STARS AMONG US

#### **Two Minutes of Goof Stuff**

On 19 June, the Lawson Field Theatre came alive with the premiere of Two Minutes of Good Stuff for 2025. This biennial short film showcase celebrates volunteers and the organisations they support.

Now in its fourth edition, the theme The Stars Among Us aligned with Matariki and National Volunteer Week, highlighting the incredible mahi taking place across Tairāwhiti. Eight inspiring films were created voluntarily by local filmmakers and captured stories of native bush restoration, food rescue, science education and heritage preservation.

Three awards were presented, each with a \$500 prize for both the filmmaker and the featured organisation. The Judges' Award and the People's Choice Award went to the East Coast Museum of Technology with a film by Bjorn Ahman. The Gisborne Volunteer Centre Board of Trustees Award was won by Gizzy Kai Rescue with a film by Jordan Perry.

# **CREATING CONNECTIONS**

#### **Group Volunteering Opportunities**

As we continue to develop our group volunteering program, we coordinated a day of volunteering for 25 Trust Tairāwhiti staff In November. They got involved in a variety of projects, including grounds work at the East Coast Museum of Technology, assembling pēpi packs for The Nest Collective, clearing blackberry on Tītīrangi with the Women's Native Tree Project Trust, and getting the Christmas trees ready for sale at Habitat for Humanity's ReStore.

#### **International Volunteer Managers and Volunteer Day**

To mark International Volunteer Managers Day, we hosted a shared lunch followed by a special Volunteer Leaders meeting. Lou Ellery from Parafed facilitated the Halberg Inclusion Training session, a valuable workshop that the Volunteer Centre team had previously taken part in. The session focused on practical ways to ensure everyone has the opportunity to participate fully.

On the 5<sup>th</sup> of December, we celebrated IVD with a morning tea at our office as a small 'Thank You' to our local volunteer community.

#### **Big Shout Out**

On Monday, 16<sup>th</sup> June, the Gisborne Volunteer Centre hosted the annual Big Shout Out Morning Tea at the Gisborne RSA. The event acknowledged the significant contributions of volunteers across the region, with around 100 attendees representing a wide range of organisations and community groups. The occasion provided an opportunity to recognise the diverse roles volunteers undertake, from supporting behind the scenes to leading front-line services, and to highlight their collective impact on strengthening our community.

#### **Retail Safety Roadshow**

In the lead-up to the busy retail season, we facilitated some of our Community Constables to visit four of our cherished local op-shops. The session aimed to look at retail safety within the individual stores but participants gained so much more. Volunteers and staff had the floor to ask questions and share scenarios to make sure they're doing the best for themself, their store and the customers.

## OPPORTUNITIES FOR RANGATAHI

We had the privilege of working alongside rangatahi at Campion College again this year, introducing students to the world of volunteering and the many ways it can enrich their lives. Through classroom presentations and one-on-one conversations, we highlighted the opportunities available in our community and showed how volunteering can fit into busy student schedules.

The students quickly recognised the benefits. For many, volunteering was not only a way to give back but also a chance to grow their personal and career skills, strengthen university or hall of residence applications, and stand out in competitive environments.

Working closely with the students also led to exciting new volunteer roles being created. Including nail pampering at local rest homes, a simple but powerful way to spark connection and joy for residents. Organisations also valued the fresh energy and perspectives students brought, though in some cases, past experiences made them hesitant. This provided a valuable space for open conversation and reassurance about the positive role young people can play.

To remove barriers, we offered on-site interviews at the school as well as appointments at our Treble Court office. This flexibility made it easier for students to commit, and many did, leading to rewarding placements with groups such as Care and Craft, Gizzy Kai Rescue, and the Gisborne Aviation Museum.

By creating meaningful pathways for youth volunteering, we are not only supporting community organisations but also investing in the future leaders of Tairāwhiti.

# STRENGTHENING COMMUNITY

#### Workshops

We continue to offer a range of workshops to support individuals and non-profits. Our Funding workshop hosted by the Hapai Hapori team at the Department of Internal Affairs is always popular and a welcome resource for our community groups. A highlight this year was the Stress Less This Summer workshop for volunteers by Amanda Roe. The focus of this was on looking after yourself so you have the capacity to keep doing what you love to do - especially volunteering!

#### **Member Organisations**

This year, we placed a strong focus on connecting with our member organisations. By getting out into the community, we've had the opportunity to meet with many of our members, learn more about their services, listen to the challenges they face, and explore how the Volunteer Centre can add value and ease some of the pressures they experience.

#### Relay for Life

We entered as team 'GVC and Friends' and had an amazing experience at the 2025 Cancer Society's Relay for Life. It was great to go and wave the Gisborne Volunteer Centre flag both metaphorically and physically! Congratulations to all the teams and volunteers involved in another successful event.

#### **Christmas Gift Wrapping Fundraiser**

This year, we expanded our Christmas Gift Wrapping experience to include more opportunities for connection with two gift tag-making crafternoons. It was an awesome way for volunteers to relax and contribute before the hustle and bustle of the gift wrapping stall at The Warehouse. The addition of EFTPOS payments this year enabled us to serve more of our community and contributed to an increase in funds raised.

#### **Volunteer Leaders Meetings**

Always a highlight of our regular events, the volunteer leaders' meetings capture those who coordinate or manage volunteers in Tairāwhiti. Held every second month, we mix up between internal and external presenters. We tackle topics relevant to our cohort which culminated in a Best Practice Guidelines Workshop hosted by Heidi Quinn from Volunteering New Zealand in June.



# FINDING COMMUNITY

When Kerry and her family set off from the UK to spend four months in Gisborne, she was excited to explore the region. What she didn't expect was that a simple stroll with her pēpi would lead to a rewarding volunteering experience and a strong connection with the local community.

On her very first day out, Kerry wandered past our Treble Court office and decided to step inside to learn more about volunteering. A quick chat later, we introduced her to the Women's Native Tree Project Trust (WNTPT) — an organisation that shared her values and welcomed pēpi too.



The process moved swiftly for Kerry! On Monday, Kerry was in our office. Tuesday, she spoke with Kauri from WNTPT, and by Wednesday, Kerry was getting her hands dirty on her first 'Weeding Wednesday'. From the start, Kerry felt warmly embraced by the WNTPT whānau. She was touched by their kindness, their inclusive spirit, and their warm welcome to her and her little one. They enjoy shared kai at the end of each session, bringing the volunteers together to reflect, connect, and enjoy each other's company. Kerry encouraged other mums to volunteer as well, spreading the word and growing the network of people making a difference.

Through volunteering, Kerry found a special way to connect with the Gisborne community. She loved meeting locals, hearing their stories, and gaining a deeper appreciation of our native flora and Māori culture. Each session provided a sense of therapy, as she immersed herself in horticulture and the nurturing of native trees.

As her time in Gisborne came to an end, Kerry left with new knowledge, friendships, and a lasting connection to the place and people who welcomed her so openly. Her journey is a beautiful reminder of how volunteering can bring people together, create lasting impact, and turn a simple chance encounter into something truly meaningful.
